5	Section 1. Upon date of hire, all faculty shall be assigned the academic rank which most
6	closely reflects the duties described in his or her contract and job description, his or her
7	education, and experience. Nothing shall preclude a faculty member from performing
8	duties not described in his or her specific rank, as long as those duties are agreed to
9	through the contract and job description.

10	Section 2. The following definitions shall govern the use of academic rank:
11	(a) AFFILIATED FACULTY: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for
12	individuals who do not receive monetary compensation by the institution for which
13	services are rendered. They can be unpaid invited guests for a temporary length of time or
14	individuals who on a consistent basis lend their expertise and/or collaborate on teaching
15	and research. Affiliate status is approved for a specified length of time and must be
16	renewed should the association continue. Associated ranks are at the discretion of the
17	institution.
18	(b) CLINICAL FACULTY OR PROFESSOR OF PRACTICES: A NTTF (Non-Tenure
19	Track Faculty) appointment for individuals with primary duties in the area of clinical
20	instruction or professionally related community education/service. Clinical faculty or
21	professor of practice members are licensed or certified professionals, or individuals in
22	professional fields. The major responsibility involves the education of students/learners
23	in academic and clinical settings, supervising clinical experiences, and/or engaging in
24	professionally related community service. Scholarly activity may or may not be required.
25	Ranks in this category in ascending order are assistant clinical professor, associate
26	clinical professor, and clinical professor; or assistant professor of practice, associate
27	professor of practice, and professor of practice.
28	(c) INSTRUCTOR: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for individuals
29	with unclassified instructional appointments whose functions are devoted exclusively or
30	primarily to undergraduate instruction. Such appointments include advising and
31	mentoring expectations congruent with creative and engaged undergraduate instruction,
32	including the possibility of involvement in design and development of courses and the
33	curriculum. Ranks in this category in ascending order are instructor, senior instructor I,
34	senior instructor II.
35	(d) LECTURER: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for individuals with
36	unclassified instructional appointments whose functions may include significant
37	responsibilities for graduate level instruction. The appointment may also include upper

- division undergraduate instruction. Such appointments must include significant
- 2 mentoring and advising responsibilities and a significant measure of responsibility for
- 3 graduate education. Appointments in the lecturer series will always require the terminal
- 4 degree (or its professional equivalent for certain adjunct appointments), but the holding
- 5 of a terminal degree in itself does not constitute an argument for appointment in the
- 6 lecturer series. Ranks in this category in ascending order are lecturer, senior lecturer I,
- 7 senior lecturer II.
- 8 (e) LIBRARIAN: A ranked appointment that depends on a terminal professional degree
- 9 in librarianship (typically, a Masters in Library or Information Science) or a position-
- 10 relevant professional/academic degree plus appropriate experience. Such degree
- requirements ensure proper professional training, but also provide the flexibility to open
- 12 appointments to a broader range of qualified applicants. Ranks in this category in
- ascending order are assistant librarian, associate librarian, and senior librarian.
- 14 (f) RESEARCH ASSISTANT: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for
- individuals who have typically earned a bachelor's or master's degree and conduct
- research under the direction of a tenure-related faculty member, a research associate or a
- 17 research faculty. Ranks in this category in ascending order are research assistant, senior
- 18 research assistant I, senior research assistant II.
- 19 (g) RESEARCH ASSOCIATE: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for
- 20 individuals who have typically earned doctoral degree (or an advanced or professional
- 21 degree in the field typically the terminal degree, plus appropriate experience) or conduct
- 22 research independently. Ranks in this category in ascending order are research associate,
- senior research associate I, senior research associate II.
- 24 (h) RESEARCH FACULTY: A NTTF (Non-Tenure Track Faculty) appointment for
- 25 individuals who are primarily engaged in research at a level normally appropriate for a
- professorial rank. Ranks in this category in ascending order are research assistant
- 27 professor, research associate professor, and research professor.
- 28 (i) TENURE-TRACK AND TENURED FACULTY. A faculty position assigned to an
- 29 academic department wherein the incumbent holds academic rank and is eligible for
- 30 tenure or is tenured. Ranks in this category in ascending order are assistant professor,
- 31 associate professor, and professor. The rank of distinguished professor may be bestowed
- 32 based on criteria established by a university.
- 33 Section 3. The terms "affiliate," "adjunct," "visiting," "fellow," "emeriti," "postdoctoral"
- or other appropriate terms may be used and/or added to academic title and/or ranks in
- 35 those cases in which the institution wishes 1) to draw upon the skills of certain persons in
- 36 the community or in other educational, industrial or governmental institutions for help in
- 37 carrying forward teaching, research or service commitments (e.g., doctors, dentists,

- 1 lawyers, psychiatrists, professors or administrators at other academic or governmental
- 2 institutions, public school teachers or administrators), 2) where the appointment is
- 3 planned for a limited duration, or 3) as an honorific title.
- 4 Section 4. All associated ranks of Instructors, Lecturers, Research Assistants, Research
- 5 Associates, Librarian, and Research Faculty are commonly called "Career NTTF"
- 6 positions when they do not carry one of the modifiers listed in Section 3.
- All ranks with the modifiers "affiliate," "adjunct," "visiting," "fellow," "postdoctoral"
- 8 and "emeriti," are commonly called "Adjunct NTTF" positions.
- 9 Section 5. The parties agree to form the Rank Reclassification Committee, a joint
- 10 committee made up of two Union representatives and two Administration representatives
- to hear petitions to reclassify a faculty member's academic rank. The Rank
- 12 Reclassification Committee will make recommendations to the Provost. The Provost will
- be responsible for the final decision.
- 14 Section 6. All faculty shall have the right to petition for rank reclassification if they
- believe that their work was misclassified at the time of first hire or their position has
- evolved to more closely resemble a different classification.
- 17 "Adjuncts" who believe that their positions should be "Career" appointments, can
- 18 petition for reclassification after completing their second year of appointment and/or
- major review. Because the defining characteristic of the "adjunct" classification is its
- 20 limited duration, the recommendation of the Rank Reclassification Committee and
- 21 decision of the Provost should be guided by the current duration of appointment, the
- reasonable expectation of future appointment, and completion of successful review(s).
- 23 Section 7. If a faculty member is successful in petitioning for reclassification, their new
- 24 academic rank shall take effect at the beginning of the next term.
- 25 Section 8. Career NTTF who change academic ranks shall retain their "years of service"
- for the purposes of promotion, unless the faculty member agrees to adjust the number.
- 27 Section 9. Nothing in this Article prevents a department or employing unit from hiring an
- Adjunct into a Career NTTF position without going through the Rank Reclassification
- 29 process.
- 30 **Section 10.** No faculty member will be subject to discrimination, discipline, or
- 31 termination resulting from their legitimate participation Rank Reclassification process.
